The ballot then will disappear, and you will be returned to your database record. (While online, we ask that you please update anything that may be outdated with your record.) You are allowed only one ballot, and once it is submitted, no changes can be made. This voting option will expire at midnight Thursday Dec. 1 (i.e. the ballot will disappear from your database record).

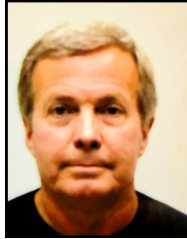

Clint Berger

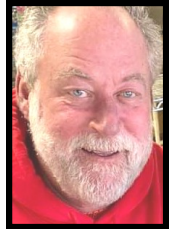

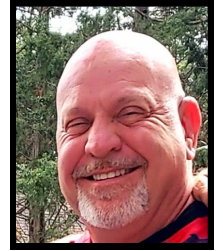
Jim Mueller

John Shoebrook

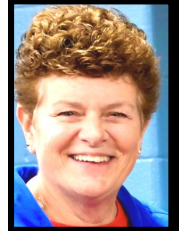
