Message from Clint Berger, President

For those of you who attended our Annual Membership Meeting back on December 6, 2025, you've already been enlightened with the following message theme from me. If you took that meeting's plea to heart, then you need not concern yourself with the following. For the rest of you, I request you please read on.

First of all, I am not against any one of our members having a social alcoholic beverage after their league games—if permitted / allowed by the appropriate park authorities. Even I have my "one" beer each week after my team's Tuesday night games at Black Bob Park. But too much of a good thing is the basis of this message. We simply had too many alcohol-related situations or confrontations during our games in 2025, whereby I feel it is something toward which we should no longer simply look the other way.

Thus, I am sharing the following with you (from SSUSA's Rule Book).

5.11 • CONSUMPTION OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES OR MARIJUANA: The consumption of alcoholic beverages or marijuana in the dugouts or within the confines of the playing field is prohibited. EFFECT: The penalty shall be the ejection of the player for the remainder of the team's games for that day. Teams shall receive a warning for a first offense. A second offense shall result in an ejection of that player from the team's current game, or from the next game if the alcohol is discovered between games. If you come back from the bleachers (into the dugout or back onto the playing field) and end up being a distraction to the game—on or off the field—or become unruly to your fellow players, the opposition, or the umpires as a result of the alcohol, then you've gone too far. If you can't "control your liquor," then wait until after the game to partake.



This does not prohibit you from having a beer outside the parameters of the playing field and beyond the confines of the dugout. In other words, take your bat bag, cooler, or whatever container you possess in which you have your alcohol away from the field / dugout. Go to the bleachers, etc.—wherever. But even then, there is a limit, or bottom line, to all of this. If you come back from the bleachers (into the dugout or back onto the playing field) and end up being a distraction to the game—on or off the field—or become unruly to your fellow players, the opposition, or the umpires as a result of the alcohol, then you've gone too far. If you can't "control your liquor," then wait until after the game to partake.

Again, as I stated on December 6th, if you can't refrain from consuming alcohol for two hours (during your doubleheader), then please get in touch with me or one of your board members. I'm aware of at least 20 AA locations in the Kansas City metropolitan area that I can recommend to you for help with the problem.

YES, we want you to have fun and socialize with your fellow teammates and even your opposition and the umpire during the games. But please...we all have to be considerate of others, your fellow players, etc. Be appreciative of the opportunity that is being presented to you and that you are able to partake in.

As our beloved and highly-respected founder Wes Weddle was fond of saying: "Remember, if you play the game, have a good time, and lose, you are still a winner." So yes, we can all be winners...it just doesn't have to be on the scoreboard.

The 2025 Treasurer's Report

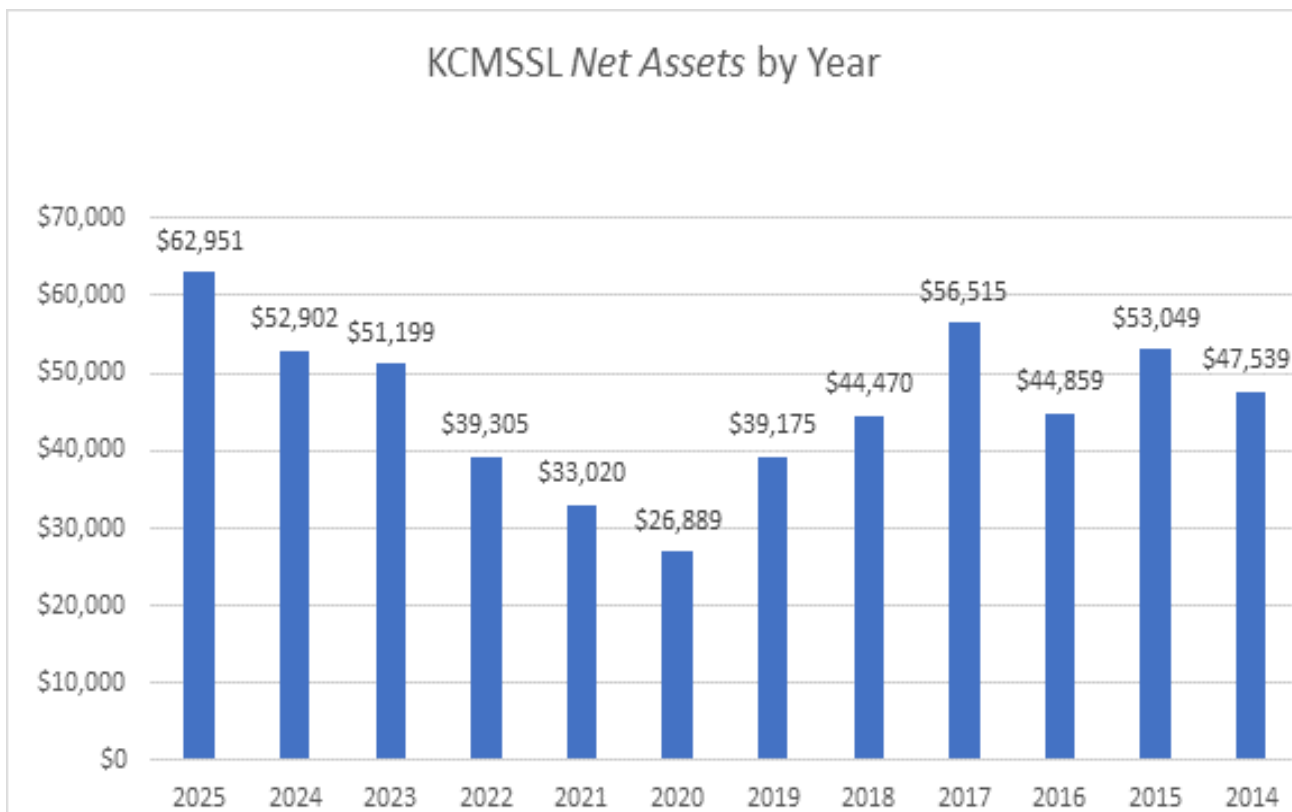

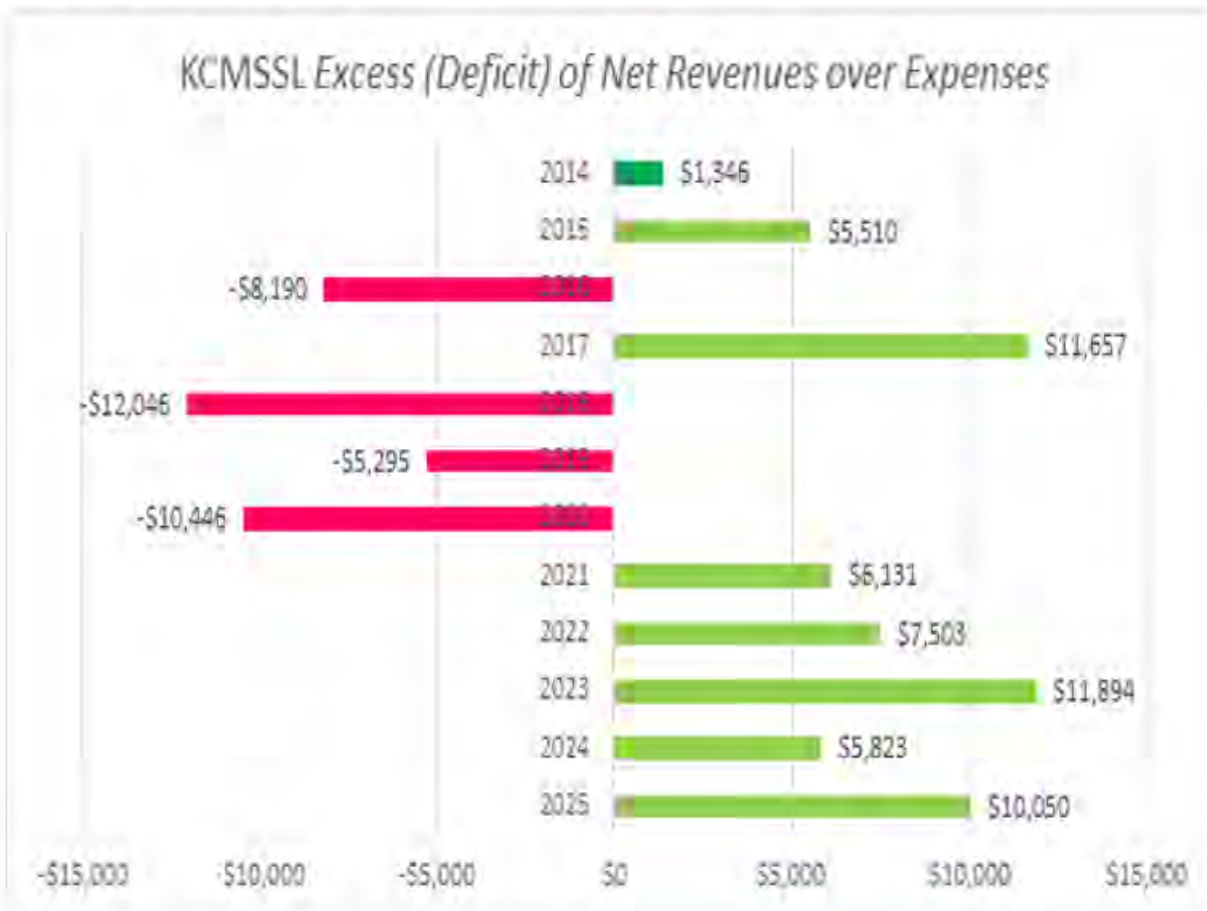
I am happy to report to you that your league remains in a solid and improving financial position – and unlike some of our aging players' knees, our balance sheet is actually getting *better* with time!

We ended 2025 with Net Assets of \$62,951. Net Assets are the amount by which our total assets exceed our total liabilities. Net Assets are what we, in our personal lives, would call our net worth – or in softball terms, it's like having a deep bench when you really need it.

As shown in the following graph, we have steadily rebuilt our Net Assets from the lows reached during the 2020 and 2021 COVID years. Think of it as our league's comeback story – we've recovered faster than most of us recover from a doubleheader! The board of directors monitors Net Assets to ensure our ongoing financial stability (someone must keep an eye on the money while the rest of us argue about balls, strikes, and team ratings).



The following summarizes the recent Total Organization's annual **Excess (Gain)** or **Deficit (Loss)** in Revenues Over Expenses. A negative number (shown to the left of the center) means the expenses exceeded revenues in that particular year, kind of like when you lose more games than you win, but with dollars instead of runs.



The 2025 Total Organization excess revenue over expenses of \$10,050 is developed from our four operating funds: General Operations, Competitive Conferences, Draft Conferences, and Contingency Funds (Fundraising and Unrestricted Sponsorships). It's like dividing up the pizza after a game, but with a lot more spreadsheets involved.

General Operations revenue consists mostly of our membership dues, sponsorships, and the interest earned in our money market account. This revenue is offset by our General Operations expenses (those **not** directly related to the Competitive and Draft conferences or Contingency Funds). Translation: your annual membership dues, sponsorships, and interest income pay for the stuff that keeps the league running between innings.

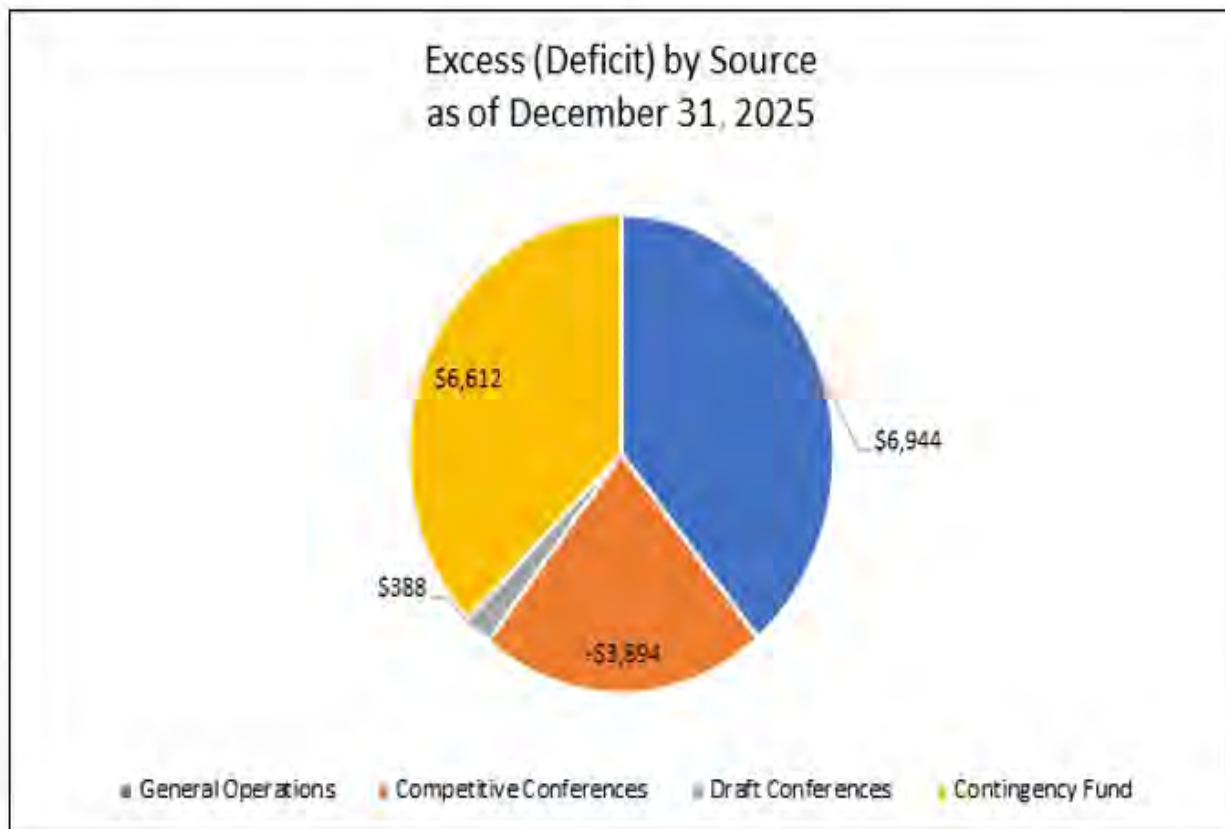
In 2023, we set a financial goal for General Operations, as well as the Competitive and Draft conferences, to each operate at or near break-even in most years. We also set a financial goal to build our Contingency Fund through fundraising and unrestricted sponsorships to cover periodic extraordinary events or expenses. The Contingency Fund is basically our league's emergency stash – for when the unexpected happens, like when someone actually reads the rulebook.

The chart below shows that our 2025 General Operations resulted in a revenue **excess** of **\$6,944** over expenses – a solid hit into the gap!

The Competitive Conferences came in with a **\$3,894 deficit** primarily due to planned use of some of the 2024 excess and some unbudgeted games being played at the end of the season. Apparently, some of us just couldn't quit playing.

The draft conferences budgeted for breakeven but pulled a classic squeeze play, plating a **\$388 excess** to keep us in the game.

Due to the net gain from the 2025 Wes Weddle Classic tournament (\$4,342) and an unrestricted sponsorship (\$2,500, less \$230 of related expense), we added \$6,612 to our Contingency Fund in 2025. The Wes Weddle Classic and our sponsors continue to be financial MVPs!

The revamped Marketing Committee has implemented some new marketing tactics for the 2026 season in order to reach the KCMSSL's two major goals:

**Increase membership and breach that elusive 1000 mark; and
Bring in younger members in both the men's and women's conferences.**

As of now our men's median age is 65. The women's is 52, and the entire league median age is 62.

There is no doubt that we are a strong, vibrant organization with 90 teams playing in 6 locations (3 in Missouri and 3 in Kansas), 6 days / nights of the week, as recognized by SSUSA as one of the largest senior softball organizations in the country.

But as the numbers above show, we need to continually bring new, younger members into the league.

Will 2026 be the year that the KCMSSL tops the 1000-member mark? Will our membership median age drop? Only time will tell, but in order to help us reach those goals—all of us—and I mean ALL OF US--can do our part to get us there. Currently, we have 60 new members who have registered to play in the KCMSSL for the first time. We polled these new members, and the vast majority have joined based on word of mouth—YOUR WORD OF MOUTH. Yes, the single most effective method for driving new members has been and will continue to be each and every one of you talking to family, friends, neighbors, co-workers, and strangers (service providers, etc.) about senior softball and the KCMSSL.

Taking a baseball metaphor: In a career, if you get 3 hits out of 10 for a .300 batting average, you have a strong likelihood of getting into the Hall of Fame. Imagine if each of our current 950+ members talked to 10 people and just had a .100 batting average, that would be an incredible increase of 950 members—doubling our current number. Unrealistic—probably, but what if we halved that number or quartered that number—we'd still get a substantial increase in membership. It's not hard—all you must do is start with a conversation.

In order to augment and implement this membership drive and quest to lower our members' age demographic, the marketing committee has taken the following initiatives:

We are increasing the KCMSSL's social media presence by adding: Instagram, Twitter, Linked In, and Next Door to our portfolio which already includes Facebook. Again, this is where YOU come in. We are all on one or more of these platforms and can get our League information, messages, and photos out to large numbers of people that we might not see or talk to with the click of a button. YOU can help, and YOU can do this.

- Our tri-fold marketing brochure is a great leave-behind piece, and we have increased our coverage of gyms and sporting facilities (pickleball indoor hitting venues) as well as senior living communities and community centers. Again, and I apologize if I sound like a broken record, YOU can assist us by taking brochures and leaving them in places that you frequent—bars, restaurants, churches, barber shops, etc.
- We have blank business cards that you all can have access to. You meet someone. You talk to them about the League. You give them a business card with your contact information. Maybe they join. Maybe they don't, but at least the seed is planted. If not this year, maybe next year.
- Our street sign campaign has now been limited to Roe Park but still is effective in generating interest and bringing in new members.
- We are always trying to get local media coverage—both print and TV. If anyone has any good media contacts, please let us know.

Folks—it takes a village to succeed. We have a **few** really hard-working individuals who are donating their time, energy, and manpower to help the KCMSSL to become healthier, stronger, and hopefully younger. **YOU** can help them. If you have time, ideas, contacts, and experience and are willing to roll up your sleeves to assist in these projects or others, please join in—the more the merrier! If **YOU** aren't able to be in the forefront, **YOU** can always use your social media platforms to help get the message out, and **YOU** can simply talk to people about the league.

The KCMSSL is strong because of **YOUR** participation. Your continued support is appreciated and welcome. Thank you.

An Overview of the 2026 Draft Conferences

Draft Conferences keep getting bigger and stronger! In 2025 we had 271 draft players on 23 teams.

In 2026 we are anticipating approximately 300 draft players on 25 teams (Registration is still ongoing so numbers are approximate and projected).

The Monday morning 70+ Draft Conference, played at the Frank White Sports Complex continues to expand with the addition of 1 new team in 2026 bringing the total number of teams to 8 with approximately 112—120 players.

Tuesday's 50+ evening conference in Independence will hold steady at 4 teams and will be slightly down in players this year.

Thursday's 60+ morning conference also at the Frank White Sports Complex will literally duplicate it's 2025 numbers with 7 teams having the maximum number of players of 15 per team for a total of 105.

The Saturday 60+ draft morning conference is also expected to grow from 5 to 6 teams with close to 90 players.

Kudos to the conference coordinators and assistant coordinators for their hard work and long hours dedicated to recruitment, field personnel contacts and discussions and for conducting the intricate and detailed draft process. When you see them, please thank them:

The growth, stability and interest in the draft conferences stems from the manner in which the teams are comprised through a blind draft process which has each team, based on the ratings of the players on the roster, to end up with very similar team ratings. This provides a very equal, competitive conference where, as the old cliché goes, "On any given day...any team can win!"

The move to the Frank White Sports Complex last year proved to be a winning move and we are pleased to be returning again in 2026 to play on those infield turf and outfield grass fields.

The Saturday draft is benefitting from the closure of the Saturday morning competitive conference as a number of players wishing to still play Saturday morning will be gravitating to the draft.

2025-2026 Monday 70+ Draft Conference

The Monday 70+ Draft Conference returns to the Frank White Sports Complex for a second season in 2026. The complex received great reviews last year due to its turf infields, 300-foot outfield fences, and being well-maintained throughout. In 2025, the Gold team, managed by Rich Talavera and Terry Nichols, swept through the competition in impressive fashion, going 21-3 (an .875 winning percentage) to take the championship. The Green team, led by Barry Gordon and Mark Schulte, came in second at 18-6. Green claimed the post-season tournament title. A second Monday session, which covered five weeks of play, ended with Green and Purple, managed by Jack Allen and Larry Branson, as co-champions.

The first key date for the 2026 season is April 4, when we will conduct the 70+ Monday Conference draft. Games are scheduled to begin April 27, with a double-round robin format.

With the draft fast approaching, all interested players are encouraged to sign up soon through the KC Metro Senior Softball League website (kcseniorsoftball.org).

Thanks to Mike Curley for his hard work last season as the Monday Draft Conference coordinator. This year he joins Dave Babson, Terry Davis, Barry Gordon, John (Doc) Lofflin, Mike Koontz, and Jody Myers as managers. Good luck to all.

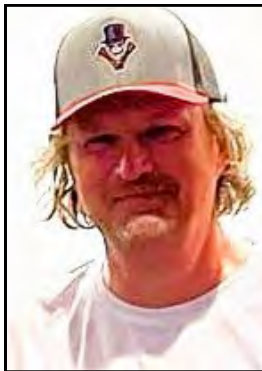


Tuesday 55+ CONFERENCE

The Red and Dark Green teams tied atop the standings at 17-7 – a photo finish that had us checking the scoreboard twice! Green lagged one game back. Dark Green then claimed the postseason crown, proving playoff magic still works past 60.

Player Feedback and 2026 Format

Our end-of-season survey split opinions like a hung curveball: about half wanted bye weeks for tournament travelers, half favored splitting into tournament and non-tournament divisions. We opted for a single unified conference that mixes both groups, with byes scheduled around major tournaments and pick-up games added to keep non-tournament players engaged – because who wants to watch grass grow when you can play ball?

2026 Schedule Specifics

We will again play a 14-week season with a double round-robin format on non-tournament weeks. We will hold pickup games at Frank White Softball Complex on tournament weeks. All these games are included in the \$65 season fee.

If we have a **seven-team conference**, as in recent years, the cost is about \$1.55 per game, one of the best values in senior softball.

Mark your calendars for another season of thrills at Frank White. Our draft will be conducted on April 4 – stay loose!

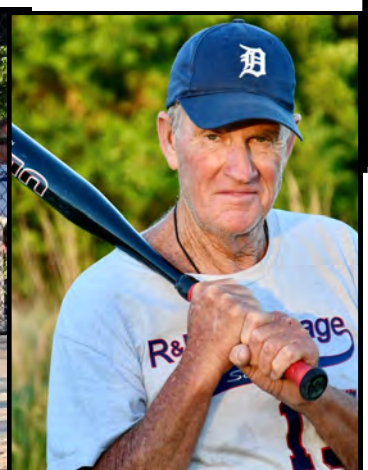

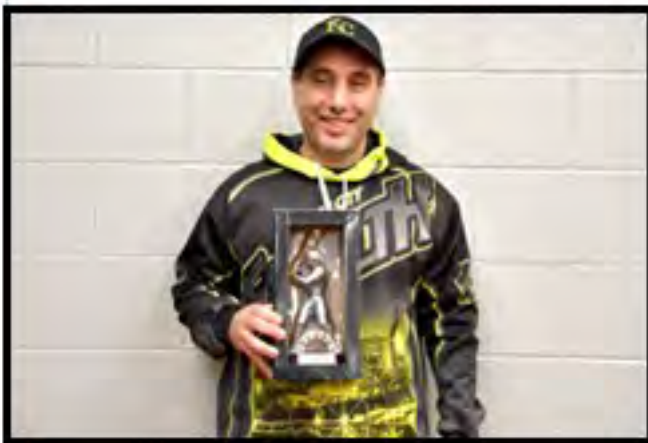

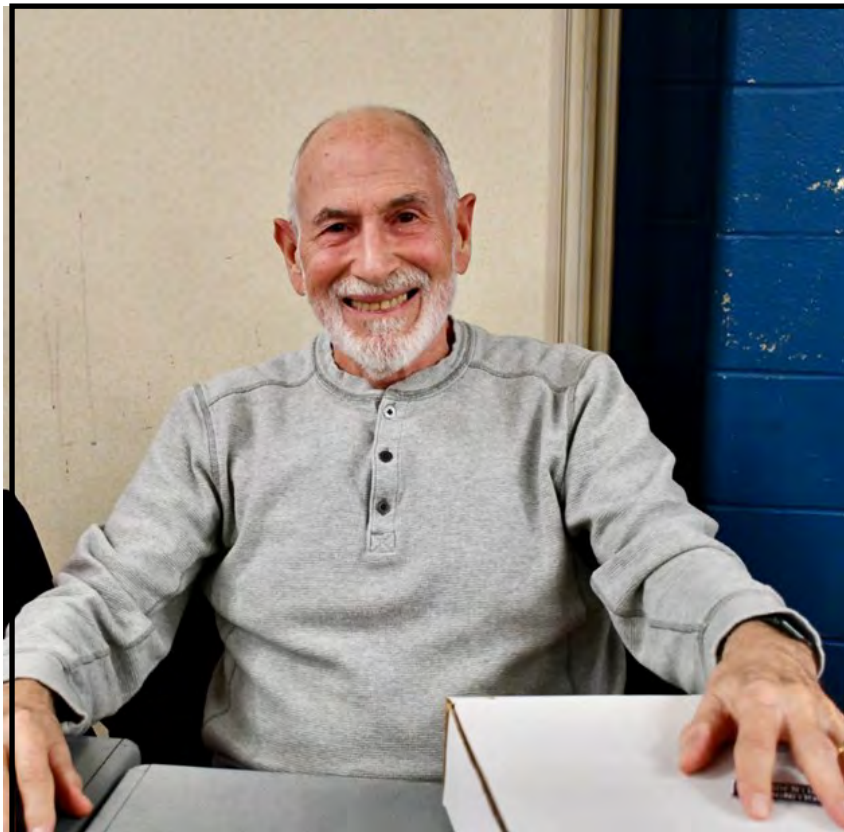
